#### TOTAL PROJECTS STILL PENDING \*DID NOT QUALIFY UNDER DISASTER DECLARATIONS

#### • Disaster Recovery

- Several Projects identified totaling \$23,135,688
  - 7 of the projects have been applied for CDBG-DR funding - \$21,194,000
    - •EPC is the sponsor for 2 positions supporting the EPC Regional Watershed \$156,261 (state funded with some county support)
- NRCS-EWP EPC to sponsor the funds, but match requirement will be property owner responsibility

#### • 2015 Flooding

- EPC road damage (after disaster EPC 100%) \$367,000
- EPC has identified \$6.5M in unfunded needs (Judge Orr Road)
